YMCA 3, 4, 5 year old Youth Soccer Rules



1. The game length will be as follows:
4, eight-minute quarters. No Overtime. No Timeouts.
2. The goals will be 4' X 8', and the goal area will be 12' X 6'. There will be no goalies. Players may not touch the ball within the goal area, but a player may run through the goal area. If a defender touches the ball in the goal area, a goal will be awarded to the offensive team.

If an offensive player touches the ball in the goal area, or the ball stops rolling in the goal area, a goal kick will be awarded to the defensive team.
Goal kicks may be taken from any point along the end line. The ball will be placed by the official (penalized team goes back 12ft. to defend the goal kick)
3. Kick-offs may be taken in any direction.
4. The ball will be thrown in from the sideline, players must be back 12ft.
5. All dead ball kicks, goal kicks, kick-ins and kick-offs are indirect kicks (no direct kicks can score, the ball must touch another player before a goal can be scored). Corner kicks and penalty kicks are direct kicks (goal can be scored directly by kicker).
6. Corner kicks are administered when a defender is the last to touch a ball that goes out of bounds on the end-line, and the defender is not in the goal area. The ball is kicked by the offense from the nearest corner. (12ft. yield distance)
7. Penalty kicks (major fouls) will be awarded, if in the referee's opinion, a scoring opportunity was nullified by the infraction. The ball is kicked from the mid-field line. All players must be behind the mid-field line when the kick is taken. All other penalty kicks will occur at the point at which they were committed with appropriate yield distance.
